RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY

You are responsible for transporting and unloading items at the site. City Crew **WILL NOT** be assisting in unloading trailers or vehicles, you are responsible for disposing all your items in the roll off dumpster.

EXAMPLES OF ITEMS THAT WILL BE ACCEPTED:

- Furniture items (beds, chairs, mattresses, etc.)
- Old carpet
- Water softeners and humidifiers

MAJOR APPLIANCES:

- Refrigerators, dishwashers, freezers, stoves, microwaves, washers, dryers, water heaters, dehumidifiers, furnaces and air conditioners

RESIDENTIAL LIGHT DEMOLITION: (ANYONE BRINGING LARGE AMOUNTS WILL BE TURNED AWAY)

- Small amounts of building material and other miscellaneous items; this includes windows, sheet rock, shingles, plaster, untreated wood, paneling, etc.

COMPUTERS, TELEVISION AND COMPUTER MONITORS

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED:

- Household hazardous waste (paint, stains, varnishes, cleaners, cement, adhesives, paint thinners, strippers, pesticides, herbicides and used motor oil)
- Tires and batteries
- Compost and yard waste
- Regular garbage and recyclables

It's Time To Register Recreational Vehicles!

Make sure you have a blue permit sticker on your ATV, UTV, or golf cart beginning **May 1, 2025**. Stop by City Hall to fill out the permit application and pay the \$15 annual registration fee (cash or check). It's illegal to operate recreational vehicles on city streets, alleys, or other public property without obtaining a permit. Please contact City Hall if you questions.



Increase on garbage and recycling from Richards Sanitation beginning April 1, 2025

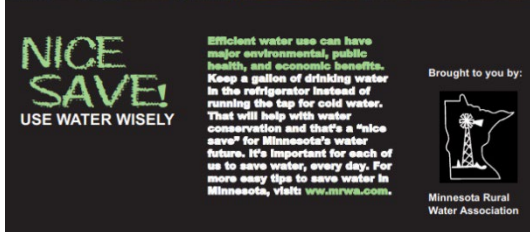
The monthly household cost for residences will increase on your April 1, 2025, statement (service for March). If you have the small garbage tote (32 gallons) you currently pay \$15.75. The new monthly fee is \$16.22, which is an increase of \$0.47. The medium tote (64 gallons) is increasing from \$17.39 to \$17.91, an increase of \$0.52 a month. The large tote (96 gallons) is increasing from \$19.04 to \$19.61, an increase of \$0.57. Recycling tote only is increasing from \$4.43 to \$4.56, an increase of

Yard Waste/Compost pickup on Mondays beginning May 5th

Our city crew will begin Monday morning yard compost pick-up. Compost pickup will be from the first Monday in **May (5/5)** through the last Monday in **October (10/27)**. Place your leaves, grass clippings and mulch into plastic bags or boxes. Brush must be cut into 4-ft lengths and no larger than 6-inches in diameter. **NO** garbage, non-biodegradable items or excessively heavy bins/bags will be accepted. Those items will be left curbside and pick up will be discontinued at your residence. If you have questions, please call city hall. Thank you for cooperating so we can continue this free service that most cities don't have.
