Pet license renewals are past due!



Progress is being made, but several pet owners have still not taken the time to properly renew their dog or cat license with the city. Licenses are good for one calendar year and are up for renewal on January 1. City ordinances require all dogs and cats to be licensed and up-to-date on their vaccinations. Residents are limited to two

pets per household. The annual license fee is \$10/animal and should be made payable to the City of Mabel. Proof of your pet's vaccinations is required. A copy is kept on file at city hall. Failure to properly license your pet may result in a fine.



Richard's Sanitation has provided the City of Mabel with a CARDBOARD **ONLY** dumpster located on the south side of the Mabel Community Center for residents to get rid of excess amounts of cardboard. The dumpster is free to use for ONLY City of Mabel residents. It will be placed there for 24 hours every day. The dumpster will stay there unless we are noticing garbage or other items being placed in there besides straight cardboard. If

It's time to register recreational vehicles! Make sure you have an blue permit sticker on your ATV, UTV, or golf cart beginning May 1, 2025. Stop by City Hall to fill out the permit application and pay the \$15 annual registration fee (cash or check). It's illegal to operate recreational vehicles on city streets, alleys or other public property without obtaining a permit. Please contact City Hall if you questions.

To Lower Home Energy Use


Outside factors, such as fuel and equipment costs and extreme weather, can impact electricity prices. But you have the power to control home energy consumption by taking proactive steps to reduce energy use.



Thermostat Management The thermostat is one of the best places to lower

Ine thermostat is one of the best places to lower your energy use because heating and cooling account for a significant portion of home energy consumption. During winter months, adjust your thermostat to the lowest comfortable setting to reduce energy use. The Dept. of Energy recommends 68 degrees or lower.

Seal Your Home



According to ENERGY STAR⁺, about 20% of heated or cooled air that moves through a home is lost due to lack of proper insulation and air leaks. Ensure your home has sufficient insulation levels and seal air leaks around windows and doors with caulk and weatherstripping. This is a simple, effective way to lower energy use and improve indoor comfort.

Maintain Equipment

The health of your heating and cooling system is essential for comfort and can greatly impact energy bills. Maintain your system by regularly replacing dirty filters and scheduling annual inspections for maintenance and necessary repairs.
